

God has refined our vision and given us a mandate to expand our tent and establish a Global House of Prayer. God has given us a game plan as to how to accomplish it. In this booklet, we share the plan. I am excited about what God is about to do. Thanks for journeying with us.

Expanding Our Tent—Establishing a House of Prayer.

GO Church has a unique place in the Kingdom of God. He has us here for a specific purpose and while we make no boast about any achievements, innovation has been a hallmark of GO Church from the very beginning. Why? Because God wired us a little differently from everyone/everywhere else.

While this is true, there are some things that ought to remain constant in all churches, such as a love for the Word of God, authentic worship, prayer and outreach. As we have fasted and prayed, we believe that God is showing us that we need to "Expand our Tent." This means several things, but one important aspect is that each and every one of us need to stretch ourselves more to reach out to those outside our tent.

When we first learned about the facilities at 333 Edwin Drive, it was being offered for sale at the cost of \$1.2M. We felt a particular call to these facilities, because for three years prior, our congregation hosted the Hampton Roads Prayer Walk, just across the street at Mt. Trashmore. Little did we know that as we "claimed the territory" surrounding the park, God would plant our congregation just a few feet away from the park. Approximately a year later, God opened the doors for us to lease the facilities. We have now been at this location for almost 6.5 years.



When we first visited the facilities, our elders felt it was a bit small for the work God has called us as a congregation to do, but having a burden to one day establish a House of Prayer, we felt it was the ideal location for this. The lease was expensive, but we knew it was an investment in God's Kingdom.

Over the years we have negotiated with the owners and eventually locked in the purchase price at \$675K, which is way below their initial \$1.2M asking price. We have also paid a non-refundable option price of \$75K, which goes towards the price of the facility, when we purchase later this year.

What's the Big Picture Plan

The **Expand Our Tent** plan in brief is that we will be purchasing our present facility and then donating it to the community to be used as a 24-Hour Global House of Prayer. We are trusting God to provide us with an alternate location to host our weekly services, classrooms and office space. Our first option is to move everything to an off-site location (with the exception of Dr. Chris' office, which will remain in the House of Prayer). All sound equipment, etc. will remain in the HOP. GO Church will be the custodian of the House of Prayer, but it will be available for the entire region to utilize for prayer.

Why are we moving the church into an alternate location?

From the very beginning, our elders felt that our present location would be temporary. Our present facility has a maximum capacity of 150 seats. We believe God has a significant role for GO Church to play globally, that exceeds the capacity of our present facility. There is also presently a lack of space for classrooms for children and teens, and a lack of space to serve the community outside of our Sunday morning activities. We continue to trust God for an alternate location. In the meantime, we are making plans to develop a structure at the back of our present facilities to house our congregation, but this would be a transition facility, until God opens the door to a new place.

Why is there the need for such a large House of Prayer?

God is going to bring revival to the Hampton Roads area and at present, there is no dedicated place large enough to house a prayer movement that will foster such a move of God. We have also shared our vision for this house of prayer and it has been embraced by THOP, which presently hosts weekly prayer meetings in our facilities. Finally, it is also an unfortunate fact that many churches are hesitant to support prayer ministries at another church. Because this will be a dedicated place for prayer, the **Global House of Prayer** will avoid many of these hang-ups.

Why Establish a 24-Hour House of Prayer?

- 1. God is worthy of night and day worship. He deserves it—after all, He gave Himself for us
- 2. When we pray "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven" we need to remember that in heaven there is eternal worship— we are simply mirroring what is happening in heaven.
- 3. United prayer has a way of bringing churches together in a way nothing else can
- 4. Jesus said in Matthew 21:13 "My house shall be called a house of prayer." He was quoting the scriptures in Isaiah 56: 7 "For My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations." Non stop prayer helps to fulfill that mission of Jesus
- 5. Prayer has always preceded great moves of God such as revivals in society. The history of revivals is filled with examples of consistent and non-stop prayer
- 6. One of the greatest thrust for international missions happened in the wake of a non-stop prayer meeting that lasted for more than 100 years. This happened among the Moravian Community of Herrnhut in Saxony, in 1727, when they commenced a round-the-clock "prayer watch" that continued nonstop for over a hundred years. By 1791, 65 years after commencement of that prayer vigil, the small Moravian community had sent 300 missionaries to the ends of the earth
- 7. Non-stop prayer most often precedes practical work in the community. The most well known HOP in the United States is the International House of Prayer in Kansas City. On September 19, 1999, IHOPKC began non-stop prayer and worship (which continues to today). Since then, they have developed ministries and outreaches which includes increasing current inner-city outreach with on-site food distribution, discipleship programs, provision of food and clothing for children's outreaches, street clean-up. Other outreaches include Children's Justice Initiative to serve orphans and children at risk. They partner with Women's Life Center, a local crisis pregnancy center helping women who refuse abortion and choose life. They are also working to provide homes and restoration programs for victims of human trafficking and domestic violence, and prostitutes who respond to the gospel.

Global House of Prayer Facilities

The aim of the plan is to donate all of our present facilities, furnishing and equipment to the Global House of Prayer



Where Does the Plan Stand Now?

- ⇒ The owners are ready to sell and we have the right of first refusal
- ⇒ We have paid a \$75K option price, which goes towards the purchase price (\$675K)
- ⇒ We are assembling a team of leaders and intercessors from our region (both Southside and Peninsula) who have a track record of serving the region in prayer, to spearhead the Global House of Prayer.
- ⇒ Intercessors from around the city have already been praying at the Global House of Prayer.
- ⇒ We are in the process of getting the word out about the plan to the community.
- ⇒ We still have a far way to go in terms of the funds we need for the deposit to acquire the facility. Please consider making a sacrificial gift towards this effort. Thanks for your partnership.

Where Will the Funding come from for all of This?




Denise McCleese Worship Leader GHOP

My heart's desire since 2002 is that there would be a dedicated place in Hampton Roads where Jesus is worshipped corporately 24/7. Why? It was 2003 that God through the hearing of His Word in song over and over, began the healing of my Heart, restored my marriage and created in both of us a love for the Word of God from a place of 24/7 prayer. Furthermore Jesus is worthy. May the fire on the altar never go out.

Why GO Church can be trusted as custodian of the House

- 1. Long before GO Church was a church, from our very first negotiations for a facility, we have carried the dream of one day establishing a House of Prayer. Pictured is the blueprint design for use of space for the first building we were in negotiations for and the 24-7 HOP (indicated by red square) was always a part of the plan. In other words, the establishment of a 24-7 House of Prayer is a part of our DNA.
- 2. From our very first service, GO Church has devoted 10-15 minutes in each service to pray for a different nation/people group. To date, we have prayed for every nation on earth and are now praying for unreached people groups worldwide.



3. We have paid the price—our congregation has knowingly made the sacrifice of paying a much larger sum for our facilities than a church our size should bear, because we know it's a down payment towards establishing the Global House of Prayer

- 4. Our leaders and congregation are on board—it is not everyday a congregation decides to give everything away to the community and then start again. That is essentially what the GO Church team has decided. We are seeking God to provide the funds to purchase our present facility, transition it to a 24-7 House of Prayer for the entire region, and continue to pay for the upkeep of that facility. Then start from scratch by moving into a new facility, furnishing it and continue to take care of both facilities.
- 5. We are already doing the work. Our facilities are presently open to the entire community for prayer. We house the Tidewater House of Prayer and there are presently teams of intercessors who pray in our facilities at various times. Up until mid-way into the COVID-19 pandemic, our facilities were opened at no charge to the community for up to 53/168 hours per week. We have not pursued adding much more hours to the schedule, because we want it to be a totally independent facility, not a specific "church facility."

GO Church has a track record of financial trustworthiness, in that for 3.5 years we paid a monthly lease of \$5,000 and for almost 6.5 years, we have paid a lease of \$6,000 monthly, plus utilities and maintenance.

A Letter to Hampton Roads Intercessors



My wife and I have been serving in missions since 1978 and have seen the need and result of persevering, united prayer. From 1995 until 2010 we lived in Virginia Beach and attended various missional prayer groups but also participated in several 24/7 worship and prayer events. In 2010, being convinced of the need for more Houses of Prayer, we relocated to Kansas City to be part of the International House of Prayer (IHOPKC). From here we planted and nurtured various sites for Houses of Prayer in the Mediterranean region.

When the Kansas City House of Prayer launched in September 1999, the host suburb of Grandview, Missouri was listed in the top ten quickest dying cities of its size in the US. Twenty-one years later the transformation is noticeable in the desirability of abstaining a house and in crime statistics. The region of Kanas City has become increasingly known as "a city on a hill" because of the church's leadership. Before 24/7 prayer unity was "impossible."

The idea of a 24/7 House of Prayer in Hampton Roads has gripped our hearts. We envision for Hampton Roads, a place that would grow into a united expression of love and faith, lifting praise and prayers to the Lord hourly to increase and empower His plans, presence and purposes.

The vision that some are putting forth now is so much in line with what God wants. The building simply houses people who pursue a vision that, without God, will be impossible to realize. A building is not everything, but it is substance to an eternal vision where worshippers of the Lamb unite in extravagant expressions of love and desire for the Lamb on the throne and the collaboration of God's good purposes. This vision is so much needed.
